

Clairton Sportsmen's Club

Membership Duration / Start / Expiration / Limitation POLICY

Club membership duration is one year. Club memberships start the month following the month in which the membership was initiated. Club memberships expire on the last day of the month in which the membership was started.

Note that there is a delay after initial membership application and before receiving a permanent membership card (and card number). At application and orientation, the member will be given a temporary membership card allowing them to use club facilities. There is a delay in receiving the permanent membership card until member application approval is received at the following Board of Directors Meeting, with card availability at the following General Membership Meeting. Although club facilities may be used, the weekly book drawing will not be available until the permanent membership card (and card number) is obtained, since the weekly book drawing is based on the member's card number

In accordance with Club Bylaws, there is a 60 day grace period after expiration, during which the member may pay their dues and reinstate their membership. After expiration and during the 60 day grace period and prior to dues payment, that person is no longer a member, is no longer permitted to use club facilities or ranges, and is no longer permitted to participate in any club activity. They are not eligible to register for or win the weekly book drawing.

Note that when dues are paid during the 60 day grace period, the month of expiration will remain the same as the original membership. Also note that there will be a delay until the member is eligible to register for or win the weekly book drawing. That delay occurs to provide time to provide a new membership card and update club records, which are updated twice a month (mid-month and end of month).

Also note that after the 60 day grace period, card numbers will be reused, and that person, desiring to be a member again, will have to repeat the application and orientation process in its entirety.
