SKEET LEAGUE GUIDELINES

SKEET conducts three in-house leagues that run throughout the year. The intent is that the leagues are social events as opposed to intense competition.

The **FALL LEAGUE** runs from approximately early September through early December.

The **WINTER LEAGUE** runs from approximately early January through mid-April.

The **SUMMER LEAGUE** runs from approximately late April through mid-August.

Each league runs approximately 16 weeks. Specific start, end and banquet dates are announced in advance of each league. During each week, league rounds can be shot Tuesdays from 9am – 1pm, Wednesdays from 5pm – 9pm, and Sundays from 12:30pm – 4pm. League rounds can also be shot off hours.

Shooters can participate in either the 12 gauge class or .410 bore class, or both. For the 12 gauge class, 12 gauge shotguns or smaller gauges (i.e., 20 gauge or 28 gauge) can be used.

After Week 4, shooters are assigned to a team. Teams compete for high team in both classes

Each league culminates with an awards buffet banquet. Monetary prizes are awarded to the high 12 gauge gun overall, high .410 bore gun overall, high team guns for each team, and high team in both classes. Door prizes are also awarded.

LEAGUE GUIDELINES:

- Shooters must be members.
- FEES are \$5.50 per round. If both classes are shot, the second class fee is \$4.50 per round. Junior fees are \$4.00 per round, and the second class fee is \$3.00 per round.
- Shooters must shoot their first round by the end of Week 4 to participate.
- Shooters should shoot no more than 3 weeks ahead of or 3 weeks behind the league schedule. It's understood that individual circumstance vary. If shooters cannot meet the 3 week guideline, please discuss it with Skeet personnel.
- Teams are determined based on the number of participants after Week 4. Teams are set by Skeet personnel based on averages from the previous league, or current averages in the event that the shooter has not participated previously.
- Team scores are determined for each week using a set number of shooters, as determined initially by Skeet personnel, with the highest scores for each team. For example, teams may consist of 6 or 7 shooters each, with the 5 highest scores totaled for each team each week.
- All shooters who participate in and complete all three leagues will receive an additional prize at the end of the Summer League.
- Monetary prizes, door prizes, 3 league prizes, and the banquet are determined by Skeet personnel based on available league income (\$2.00 per round, \$1.00 per round Juniors).
- Shooters must complete the league or leagues to be eligible for awards.
- In the event of a tie for high individual or team awards, the award will be split.
- The high gun overall is eliminated from the high team gun award.
- A plaque is maintained in the Clubhouse Bar with the names of High Gun Overall winners.
